Brant County, Six Nations Join Forces

Six Nations elected council and Brant county council signed an accord today.

Elected chief William Montour of the Six Nations council and Mayor Ron Eddy of Brant County signed the Six Nations Green Energy Economic Accord before both councils, press and the public at the Paris fire station.

Mayor Ron Eddy and Chief Montour said there are many details still to be worked out throughout the process.

The two councils will essentially partner on all things green, and a few other items in the interest of moving forward together.

According to the accord, Brant county council and the Six Nations elected council will work towards a sustainable economic development strategy based on several mutually agreed principles.

The two will form a green energy and economic development commission with members from both councils and any other municipalities which choose to join the accord, the commission will promote green energy initiatives and the two resolve to access or develop green energy parks based along fully-serviced interchanges of Highway 403.

REM's Brant development falls within this area, located on industrial lands on Powerline Road and Oak Park Road and is to be one of the first Green Energy developments in support of the new initiatives of Six Nations and Brant County.
